

Posting to the eprint arXiv

Directions for Author Registration

1. To begin the registration, send a 'register' command by e-mail to any archive (doesn't matter which at this point), e.g.,

To: hep-th@arXiv.org
Subject: register

You will receive by e-mail response a user-id and password:

Username: your-user-id
Initial password: ABCDEF

where your-user-id is a user-id based on your e-mail username and ABCDEF (in this example) is a random sequence of letters that serves as your password.

2. To complete registration, you must fill out the Registration Form. You cannot use services requiring the user-id until the registration form is complete, and you need the user-id and password that is e-mailed to you to access the registration form.

Your user-id is unique and cannot be changed, but the password can be changed at any time by reaccessing the Registration Form.

Services restricted to registered authors are password protected. Your Web browser will prompt you for the user-id and password in order to gain access to these services. Most browsers will remember your password during any given session. If you have entered your user-id to a browser at a public windowing system, it is preferable to close down the browser session before giving access to the next user.

Formats for Text of Submission

Your submission to the archive must be in one of the following formats:

- TeX / LaTeX (if document is made from this, you must send the source)
- HTML+PNG/GIF/JPEG
- PDF (This is ideal for Word documents)
- PostScript (PDF is preferred)

Formats for Figures

Figures for a submission can be in a number of common formats. These include:

- PostScript (most common, for line drawings, plots, etc.)
- JPEG (ideal for photographic images) (to include JPEGs in TeX files, use jpeg2ps)
- PNG (best for non-photographic images (bitmaps))
- GIF (ok for non-photographic images, PNG is better)

To submit your paper

After you have registered and have your paper in one of the approved formats, go to <http://arXiv.org/uploads> and click on the Submission Form link where you will be asked for your user name and password.

Read the arXiv's response and check your submission.

After you submit your paper, you will receive a response from the archive. It is very important that you read this response. Be sure to check for errors in the copy of the abstract that appears in the message. The response to a successful submission will include a URL that will allow you to view the PostScript version generated here, together with a new username/password (specifically for that paper) for viewing it.
